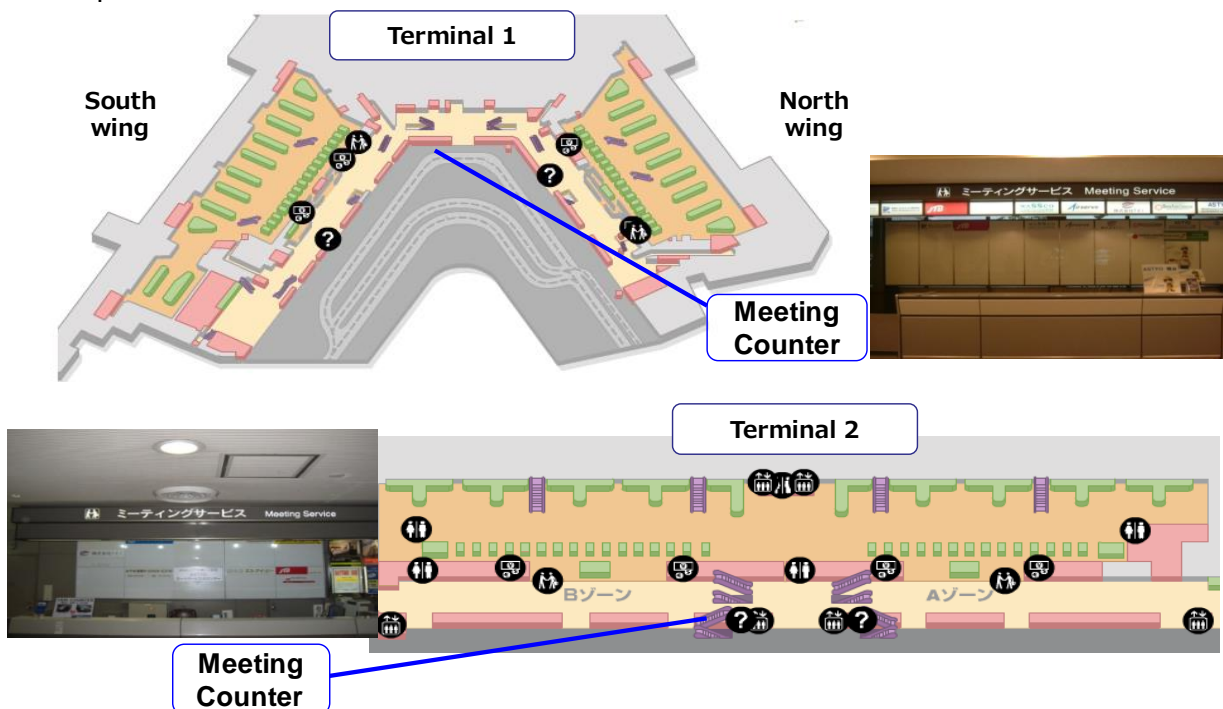

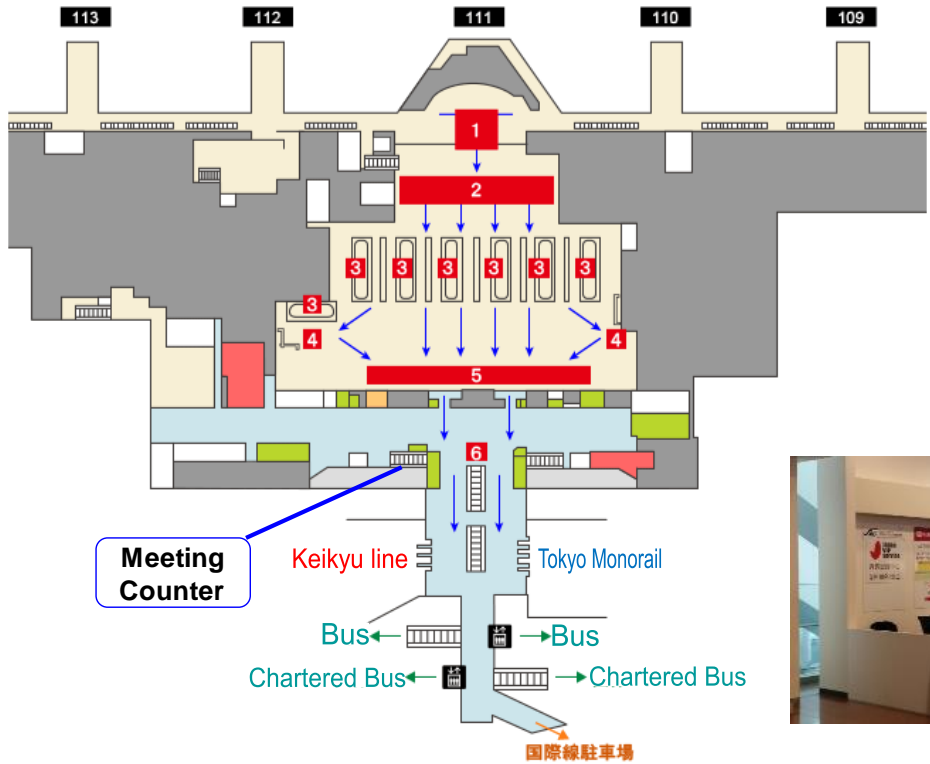

How to Book

T-1 River Cruise & Hama-rikyu Gardens

A half-hour boat cruise down the Sumida River traveling under some 14 bridges spanning Tokyo's main river, showing the capital's famous landmarks along the way. The cruise will arrive at the majestic Hama-rikyu Gardens.



T-2 Tokyo Sightseeing (drive-by) & Edo Tokyo Museum

The bus will take you past popular spots in Tokyo. You will then get off at Edo-Tokyo Museum which introduces the history and culture of Edo (the ancient name for Tokyo).



T-3 Tokyo Tower & Zojoji Temple

Enjoy this time-honored symbol of Tokyo and explore one of Tokyo's most famous Japanese Buddhism temples; Zojoji.



T-4 Kanda Myojin Shrine & Akihabara

Enjoy the traditional and modern culture of Tokyo. Kanda Myojin Shrine has a history of nearly 1,300 years. Shogun Tokugawa Ieyasu is said to have paid his respects at this shrine. Akihabara is famous for its many electronics shops and Otaku culture such as anime and manga.



T-5 Ueno Toshogu Shrine & Ameyoko Street

Ueno Toshogu is a shrine built to the memory of Shogun Tokugawa Ieyasu, the founder of the Edo Period. After visiting the Shrine, you will stroll along Ameyoko Street, which is a lively market street, almost unchanged since it was opened as a black market after WWII.



T-6 Tsukiji Market & Ginza Shopping

Enjoy shopping and walking around the Ginza area. Ginza is Tokyo's most popular place for shopping, dining, and enjoying entertainments. You will find many department stores, boutiques, restaurants, and cafes. At the Tsukiji Market, you can find both fresh and processed seafood and also vegetables.



T-7 Shinjuku-Gyoen Park & The Samurai Museum

Located in the metropolitan city, Shinjuku Gyoen is one of the largest and most popular parks in Tokyo. It was a private mansion of a wealthy family during the Edo-period and was re-designated as a national garden after WWII to open to the public. The Samurai Museum in Shinjuku is one of Tokyo's most unique spots which has quickly become popular since its opening in 2015. You can enjoy exhibits of samurai swords, armor and other weapons, and also can try on samurai armor.



T-8 Kiyosumi Gardens & Tokyo Sea Life Park

Kiyosumi Gardens are a good example of a Japanese style garden. They are home to several bird species, fish and turtles, as well as Japanese seasonal flowers. After strolling around, the tour will head to Tokyo Sea Life Park. The aquarium's main tank has a viewing area where you can see many fish including tuna, bonito and even sharks.
